



## **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

**WHICH WAS CONCLUDED BETWEEN**

**THE AGENCY FOR GEODESY,  
CARTOGRAPHY AND CADASTRE OF THE  
REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA (AGCC)**

**AND**

**LECHNER NON-PROFIT LTD.  
OF HUNGARY**

**on Cooperation in the Fields of**

**Geodesy, Cartography, Spatial Data Infrastructure, Land Administration, Cadastre,  
Remote Sensing and Geospatial Intelligence and Digital Transformation**

The Agency for Geodesy, Cartography and Cadastre (AGCC) and the Lechner Non-profit Ltd. ("LTK") of Hungary (hereinafter referred to as "the Sides"),

considering the Sides' interests to develop and enhance mutually beneficial cooperation in geospatial governance, land administration and valuation, national mapping, spatial data infrastructure and digital public services,

pursuant to the prevailing laws and regulations in their respective countries, as well as procedures and policies concerning cooperation in geodesy, cartography, spatial data infrastructure, cadastre, valuation and geospatial information management,

desiring to strengthen their cooperation in the fields of spatial data governance, digital land administration systems, INSPIRE-aligned data harmonization, considering the ongoing INSPIRE simplification and transition process in modification of monitoring, reporting and compliance, focusing on the High Value Data (HVD) regulation and within the GreenData4All framework Maintenance and Implementation Work Programme (MIWP) 2027-2030 and geospatial innovation within their respective mandates, competencies and available resources, have reached



the following understanding:

## **Article 1**

### **Objective**

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereafter referred to as “**the MOU**”) aims to promote bilateral cooperation and collaboration between the Sides in the fields of geodesy, cartography, spatial data infrastructure (SDI), land administration, cadastre, valuation, remote sensing, geospatial technologies and digital transformation of spatial services, on the basis of the principles of equality and mutual benefit, and within the respective mandates and competencies of the Sides, and in conformity with their respective national laws and regulations.

## **Article 2**

### **Scope of Cooperation**

The scope of cooperation under this MOU may include:

- a. Setting up joint research projects, especially in but not limited to technical, institutional and organizational topics related to:
  - Development and modernization of National Spatial Data Infrastructures (NSDI);
  - Harmonisation of spatial datasets in line with the INSPIRE Directive and EU geospatial standards;
  - High Value Data (HVD) regulation implementations knowledge exchange,
  - Modern geodetic reference systems and GNSS infrastructure;
  - National mapping, for example the creation of National Geospatial Base Map (NGMHu)
  - Orthophoto production and remote sensing applications;
  - Digital land administration systems and real estate cadastre;
  - Mass valuation systems of properties and sales price register;
  - 3D cadastre and digital twin concepts, where mutually agreed and relevant to ongoing projects;
  - Utility network-related spatial data, excluding sensitive and classified critical infrastructure information, and subject to applicable national regulations;
  - Geospatial support to environmental monitoring, climate resilience and territorial planning;
  - Application of artificial intelligence and advanced analytics in geospatial data processing and analytics, where appropriate and within the technical capacities of the Sides;
  - exchange of expertise in the contribution to the European Spatial Data Infrastructure (ESDI) for example within the EuroGeographics Pan-European map production and related projects;
- b. Exchange of experience on institutional governance models of national mapping and cadastre authorities;
- c. Sharing best practices on digital transformation of public geospatial services;
- d. Cooperation in EU-funded, regional and international projects.
- e. Cooperation frameworks with European and global professional institutions (ESA, NATO, United States Geospatial Intelligence Foundation, European Union Satellite Centre, International Society for Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing etc), where relevant and in line with the mandates and international obligations of the Sides.



### **Article 3**

#### **Forms of Cooperation**

The forms of cooperation under this MOU may include the following:

- a. Exchange of experts and delegations;
- b. Conducting of mutually beneficial joint research and implementing technical and technological solutions;
- c. Exchange of scientific and spatial data and information in compliance with national legislation;
- d. Voluntary cooperation in identifying funding opportunities for joint projects, education and training programmes, capacity-building initiatives and joint symposia in fields of mutual interest, subject to the availability of resources and strategic priorities of each Side;
- e. Organization of study visits, workshops, pilot demonstrations and technical consultations;
- f. Any other forms of cooperation that may be jointly decided upon by the Sides.

### **Article 4**

#### **Implementation**

1. Both Sides will strive to facilitate the cooperation referred to in Article 2 (Scope of Cooperation) through the following activities:
  - a. Appointment of a representative of each Side to facilitate direct communications (via e-mail, fax, video conferences etc.);
  - b. Holding of expert-level working meeting, the dates and locations to be jointly decided upon, in order to discuss forms of cooperation and to exchange information;
  - c. Establishment of thematic working groups, where appropriate;
  - d. Mutual collaboration to raise funds to facilitate joint projects and/or research;
  - e. Any other activities that will help to facilitate the implementation of this MOU.
2. Except when otherwise jointly decided, each Side will bear the costs of its own cooperative activities under this MOU.
3. In the case of successful establishment of a specific project, the Sides will define their specific activities, deliverables and financial arrangements in an individual agreement or contract based on this MOU.

### **Article 5**

#### **Exchange of Information**

1. Any exchange of information or other activity under this MOU shall comply with the applicable national laws and regulations of the Sides, including legislation concerning data protection, classified information and public sector information and shall be limited to non-sensitive and non-classified data unless otherwise agreed in writing on a case-by-case basis.
2. The Sides shall maintain confidentiality of data and technical information received under this MOU and shall use the data and information only for the purposes defined herein.

### **Article 6**



### General Provisions

1. This MOU does not create any legally binding obligations under national or international law.
2. This MOU will be carried out within the framework of the respective laws and regulations of the two Sides and subject to the availability of appropriated funds and personnel of the Sides, and does not imply any obligation to initiate specific projects or activities.
3. This MOU will not give rise to any claims to compensation for services provided by either Side.
4. Any differences arising in the interpretation and/or implementation of this MOU will be settled amicably through consultations or negotiations between the Sides.

### Article 7

#### Entry into Effect, Amendment and Termination

1. This MOU enters into effect on the date of signature and remains valid for five (5) years.
2. This MOU may be extended by mutual written consent of the Sides.
3. The MOU may be amended in writing by mutual agreement.
4. Either Side may terminate the MOU by providing six (6) months' written notice.
5. Termination does not affect ongoing cooperative activities unless mutually decided.
6. This MOU does not constitute an international treaty and creates no legally binding obligations.
